HOME-SCHOOL PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT

Everyone in the Rainhill Community should conduct themselves responsibly around school, show respect to one another and their property and observe our Minimum Expectations (below):

MINIMUM EXPECTATIONS

- **Everybody has a right to be safe (Physically and Psychologically);**
- **Teachers have a right to teach;**
- **Pupils have a right to learn;**
- **Everybody has a right to be treated with dignity and respect.**

We ask pupils to commit themselves to:

- Attending school regularly and being on time
- Follow all reasonable instructions from all staff first time given
- Showing courtesy and respect to everyone
- Listening to and accepting advice from teachers
- Working to the best of their ability
- Asking for help as necessary but be prepared to wait their turn
- Following the Behaviour Policy and having a positive attitude to school
- Ensuring they have the correct uniform and equipment for learning

The school will commit itself to:

- Setting work of an appropriate standard
- Recognise and encourage achievement and success
- Informing parents/carers of any concerns we may have about the pupil
- Treating the pupil with respect and courtesy always
- Maintain an orderly atmosphere in the classroom to ensure a safe, learning environment that promotes confident learning
- Provide support and encouragement for all pupils

We ask parents/carers to commit themselves to:

- Ensuring your child keeps to the terms of this agreement
- Supporting the Executive Principal and staff
- Supporting the School Behaviour Policy
- Ensuring your child attends school regularly and on time

- Communicating regularly with the school
- Acknowledging your child's progress will depend upon respecting school rules and good behaviour
- Ensuring your child attends school fully equipped for learning and in full school uniform
- Attending Parent's Evenings and Review Days to support your child's progress
